



Subject: **Addendum re Memo on SY 2021-2022**

For the First Semester, School Year 2021-2022, all classes shall be offered online. These classes include laboratory classes that can be conducted online based on the assessment of the colleges.

The current CHED circular does not allow mandatory onsite classes even for those programs that have been allowed to conduct gradual face-to-face classes.

If CHED updates its circular by allowing the conduct of face-to-face classes on or before First Semester, School Year 2021-2022, CCJE, CEAT, and CSCS shall continue to conduct online classes for laboratory subjects that can be done virtually with provisions for supplemental onsite sessions, if the student opts to attend such sessions.

Depending on the decision of these colleges, laboratory classes that cannot be conducted virtually would have to be taken as additional subjects once face-to-face is allowed.

Another option these colleges consider is that the final grades of the student in laboratory classes that cannot be entirely conducted virtually will be released once the onsite components of these classes are satisfied.

The rest of the colleges (CLAC, CTHM, COEd, CBAA) shall conduct their laboratory classes online.

In the case of Senior High School, all classes for the First Semester, School Year 2021-2022 shall be conducted via online mode.



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

Subject: **SY 2021-2022**

We are currently preparing for SY 2021-2022. The following are the scenarios that must be expected for your guidance:

1. If the Inter-Agency Task Force on Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF) would allow onsite classes, the University will only require minimal onsite meetings in identified programs subjects, NOT ALL. Kindly coordinate with your respective Deans/HS principal for the details as they are already finalizing the arrangements for subjects for the 1st term of SY 2021-2022.
2. If the IATF would still not allow onsite classes, lab and OJT subjects which cannot be offered under a fully online mode, would have to be taken as overload on the semester in which they are allowed to be offered. Please also coordinate with your respective Deans/HS principal for updates.

Rest assured that DLSU-D is taking into primary consideration the safety of all stakeholders and the quality of education that must be delivered in its decisions.
