De La Salle University-Dasmariñas (DLSU-D) recently hosted PANIMOLA: The DLSU-D Freshman Orientation from August 12-16, 2024, in preparation for the new academic year. This event involved a series of activities organized by the Office of the Provost and the Lasallian Mission Office in partnership with the Office of Student Services (OSS) and its constituent units and attended by first-year students and transferees across all colleges. The program aimed to introduce them to the Lasallian Identity and Mission as well as the campus' policies, guidelines, and services for students.

University President, Br. Francisco "Sockie" V. Dela Rosa, FSC, greeted new students,— highlighting the essence of welcoming new experiences the Lasallian way and encouraged them to take inspiration from "our continued achievements in academics, topnotchers, board passers, sports, and international awards for different performing arts groups..."

The week kicked off with Animowalk, a campus-wide parade spearheaded by the University Student Government (USG) followed by a Eucharistic celebration and presentations from key university administrators. The event also featured a campus tour by the Lasallian Student Ambassadors (LSA) and a recruitment fair hosted by the Council of Student Organizations (CSO).

On August 2, 2024, the Office of Student Services (OSS) Dean issued a memo directing all student organizations to align their activities with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs) starting school year 2024–2025. This new mandate aims to engage student leaders and their members in addressing both local and global sustainability challenges.

SWAFO Launches Special Program on Advanced Discipline Education (SPADE)

The Student Welfare and Formation Office (SWAFO) unveiled its Special Program on Advanced Discipline Education (SPADE) at the annual Strategies in Inspiring and Building Organizational Leadership (SIBOL) Seminar and Workshop. The event, which took place on August 21, 2024, at the DLSU-D Retreat and Conference Center (RCC) is designed to promote a culture of responsibility and discipline among students.

According to SWAFO Director, Mr. Ruel Elias, "SPADE is designed to deepen students' understanding of university policies and provides a platform for them to inquire and gain clarity on discipline policies and sanctions. By offering an onsite, class-based learning model, SPADE aims to implement a discipline education program that enables students to understand their Lasallian identity in a personal and engaging manner."

The program is set to commence in September 2024 and will be conducted during university break. "By end of the school year, colleges should have reduced their record of offenses as a result of the SPADE," Elias said. The SWAFO will also recognize the college with the lowest record of offenses in the annual *Luntiang Parangal.*
