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OSS Hosts Data Privacy Seminar

As part of the Office of Student Services (OSS) Administrators, Faculty, and Support Staff Development Series, the Office of the OSS Dean organized a seminar titled "Confidentiality Matters: Data Privacy in Student Affairs and Services" on February 21, 2025, at GSB109. This seminar aimed to educate all units within OSS regarding the critical importance of safeguarding the personal information of students at the university.

Mr. Sancho Castro, Data Protection Officer of DLSU-D, presented key provisions of Republic Act (RA) 10173 also known as the Data Privacy Act of 2012. He outlined various potential threats to data security and provided actual examples of breaches affecting both government and private organizations.

Mr. Castro also clarified who protected under this law, detailing the rights of individuals and obligations of organizations concerning the collection, storage, use, disclosure, retention, and disposal of personal data throughout the data life cycle. He emphasized the importance of protecting only personal not information but also sensitive personal information and privileged information.

Furthermore, he highlighted the rights of data subjects and the crucial need for obtaining their consent when releasing or sharing personal and sensitive information. Additionally, he stressed the penalties that a personal information officer could face for unauthorized processing, access, or disclosure of an individual's personal data.

After the seminar, the OSS Dean urged all units under OSS to review their existing procedures and practices regarding the collection and storage of students' personal information and to implement measures to mitigate the risk of potential data breaches.

The findings from their research underscore the importance of evaluating and enhancing the services provided by the Office of Student Services (OSS). These insights will guide OSS in implementing strategic improvements aimed at elevating student engagement and satisfaction.

OSS Administrators joins ISO 21001:2018 Gap Analysis and Documentation Workshop

In preparation for the university's ISO 21001 Educational **Organizations** (EOMS):2018 Management System certification, the Academic Planning and Quality Assurance Office (APQAO) hosted an event titled "EOMS Gap **Analysis** and Documentation Workshop" on February 5, 2025 at the Ayuntamiento de Gonzales Reception Hall.

Dr. Janette Rodriguez, Director of the Institute for Academic Innovation and Entrepreneurship at Holy Angel University facilitated the seminarworkshop.

She explained that conducting an EOMS Gap Analysis helps identify the disparities between DLSU-D's current higher education quality assurance system and the requirements of the ISO 21001:2018 framework and assesses the university's readiness to meet these standards.

The workshop also highlighted the importance of achieving ISO 21001:2018 certification by adhering to the principles of EOMS and formulating strategies to secure employee buy-in to cooperation ensure during implementation process. Additionally, Dr. Rodriguez provided guidance on how to effectively document the information necessary ISO certification.

After the session, all units and offices are encouraged to review their respective processes and documentation, identify any gaps, and prepare any missing documentation required for compliance.

SWAFO hosts SPADE learning session for CCJE students

On February 5, 2025, the Student Welfare and Formation Office (SWAFO) conducted a Special Program on Discipline Education (SPADE) session for 182 BS Criminology and BS Forensic Science students from the College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE). Held in two batches at FCH106-107, the session aimed to reinforce adherence to the university discipline policies and familiarize students with SWAFO's intervention tools.

Mr. Ruel Elias, SWAFO Director emphasized the proactive role of SPADE in reducing disciplinary infractions and highlighted the benefits of maintaining a clean disciplinary record. He also presented historical and recent data on CCJE student offenses to provide context for the discussion.



DLSU-D Interprets SEL Online Assessment Results for Freshmen



APSA Discussion on SEL with DLSU D Administrators and SWC Personnel

The Asian Psychological Services and Assessment (APSA) in partnership with the Student Wellness Center (SWC), Socio-Emotional conducted the Learning (SEL) online assessment for all freshmen during Academic Year 2024-2025. This initiative aimed to evaluate socio-emotional competencies kev essential for student development. Following a weeklong assessment period, a comprehensive final report was prepared for submission.

To ensure a thorough interpretation of the findings, APSA hosted a Zoom meeting on February 7, 2025 where the Institutional Student Satisfaction and School Climate Survey Report was presented to College Deans and Guidance Counselors. Vice President for Research and Training Ms. Therese dela Cruz, RGC led the session.

The discussion covered two main dimensions: Socio-Emotional Learning (SEL) and School Climate. SEL focused on critical areas such as grit, growth mindset, self-management, social awareness, self-efficacy, and self-awareness. Meanwhile, School Climate addressed factors like teacher-student connection, sense of belonging, school safety, physical surroundings, and cyber and social media safety.

A digital copy of the SEL report will be provided to each student individually along with a Parent Report User Guide to help parents understand their child's socio-emotional strengths and areas for growth. This resource aims to equip parents to provide meaningful support in their child's development.

Guidance Counselors will also incorporate SEL findings into student consultations and may pursue further research on specific SEL dimensions. These studies will guide the development of targeted interventions that promote students' holistic growth and well-being.

Embracing the Challenges of a Student Services Practitioner

Throughout her years with OSS, Ma'am Malou has navigated a variety of challenges. A recurring issue involved student leaders' non-compliance with the standing policies and guidelines of offices under OSS.

The COVID-19 pandemic marked one of the most challenging periods in her career. The sudden transition from synchronous activities onsite to stunned the DLSU-D community, leaving a void in student engagement. However, it was under her leadership as SDAO Director that the Student Activities Portal (SAP) was introduced and implemented. SAP streamlined the submission and approval of student activity proposals, transforming the process into a paperless system that made documentation faster and more efficient.

Ma'am Malou also oversaw the shift from manual to online document submission, for both SPO and SDAO which included the submission of Plan of Activities (POA) and activity proposals. Heraldo Filipino transitioned from printing hard copies to producing digital broadsheets, feature articles, and art magazines. Likewise, Vicissitude adopted an online Subscribers' Registration and Student Data Form (SDF), simplifying registration enhancing data collection.

Promoting Excellence in Campus Journalism

Among the highlights of Ma'am Malou's tenure at OSS was the 10th Lasallian Schools Press Conference (LSPCon), which SPO hosted in collaboration with Heraldo Filipino and Vicissitude in 2014. The conference aimed to reinforce the core principles of journalism and promote professionalism in campus journalism and brought together student journalists and publication heads from various member schools of De La Salle Philippines.

A Mentor for All Seasons

Ma'am Malou considers her role as a mentor one of her most fulfilling contributions.

I am their mentor, helping them discover and enhance their potential and direct their distinctive path. By providing them with an inspiring and supportive environment, I strive to hone their knowledge and character, empowering them to grow into capable, confident, and compassionate individuals ready to make a difference.

As Supervisor of Vicissitude, she continues to inspire the editorial board and staff by encouraging active participation in various initiatives and emphasizing the unit's impact on the academic community. She nurtures an environment where students can contribute their unique skills, fostering a strong sense of community and shared purpose.

To help students balance their academic responsibilities with their organizational roles, she encourages them to hone their time management skills, delegate tasks effectively, and maintain open communication with their teams. supervisors, and professors. 



Date: February 21, 2025


Venue: POLCA


