Keep your guard up against this new scam that seeks to initiate an unsuccessful or short-duration call in order to get the subscriber they're preying on to call them back.

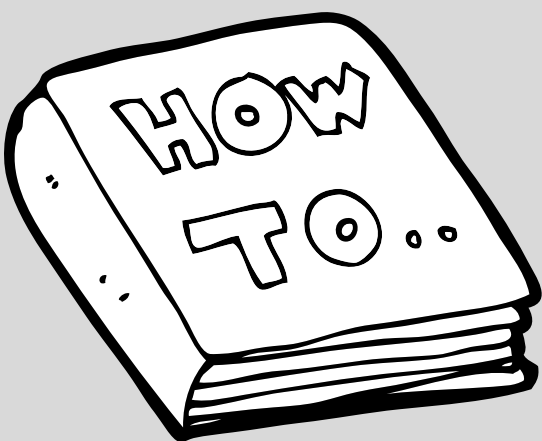
MODUS

The victims receive a call from an unknown number. The call is often dropped after several rings, leading the caller to feel that it is urgent.

The victim returns the call and incurs charges on their phone bill. Often, the call comes from an international source, leading to bigger charges.



HOW TO AVOID IT



Be discerning about incoming phone calls. Ask yourself the following questions: Were you expecting a call for work/personal engagement? Is the number calling you from a local service provider?

Refrain from returning calls from unknown numbers. Often, legitimate callers will follow through with a text to provide identification and their purpose of calling.
