From July 31st to August 6th, DLSU-D proudly hosted Teacher Thaung Hlyan Hein from La Salle Academy Yangon, Myanmar. During his week-long visit, Teacher Thaung was a key participant in the International Conference on Innovations and Inclusivity in Philippine Education: Connecting, Collaborating and Publishing (ICon 2025).

His engagement also extended to the basic education department, where he served as a guest lecturer for Grade 9 and 11 students and observed a Grade 7 class. This immersive experience enriched the academic environment and strengthened the spirit of international collaboration and knowledge exchange between the two Lasallian institutions.


