### CBAA Students Join International Virtual Lecture on Public Finance




## CEAT Hosts International Lecture on Cutting-Edge Liquefaction Mitigation Techniques

The immersion featured a series of academic and cultural engagements designed to foster professional growth and global collaboration. Highlights included:


- Orientation and courtesy visit with the administrators and teachers of the Department of Home Economics Technology.

Through DOLE-SPES, DLSU-D scholars are empowered to pursue their education with added support and embody Lasallian values by contributing their talents to meaningful and productive work.


## CEAT's Industrial Engineering Students Gain Global Perspective on Supply Chain Management








### LCDC Joins the 3rd Quarter Provincial Project Monitoring Committee Meeting
