The delegation, led by Philip Goodwin, SMC Associate Director of Alumni Engagement and Adjunct Assistant Professor, included junior and senior students from various disciplines. Coordinated by the OVPGEER, the visit provided a comprehensive experience of the Filipino Lasallian identity through a curated itinerary of heritage and service.

LSEG Welcomes New Batch of DLSU-D Scholarship Grantees



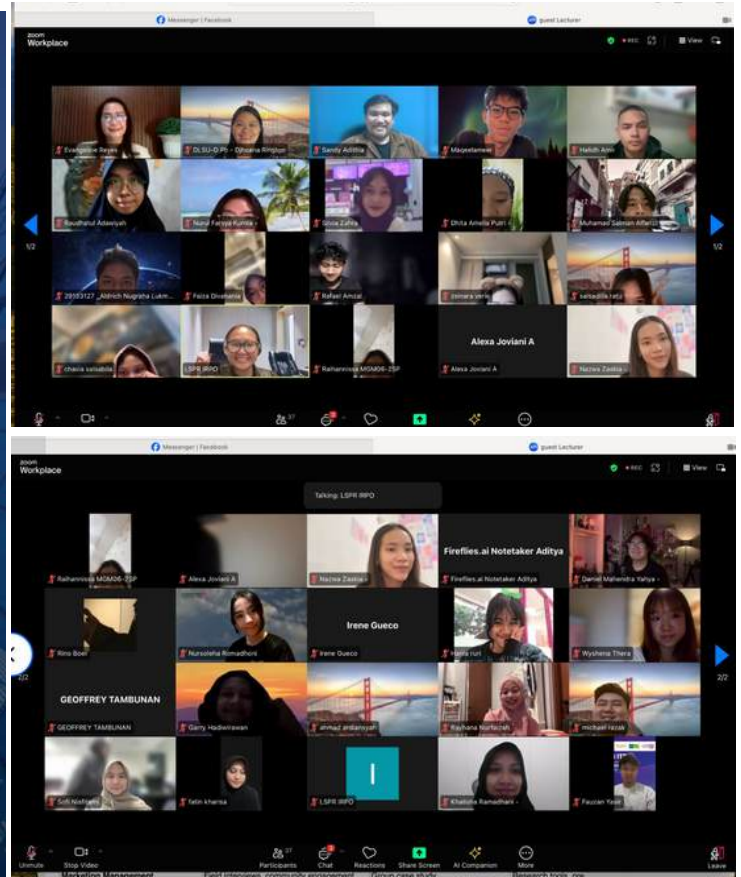
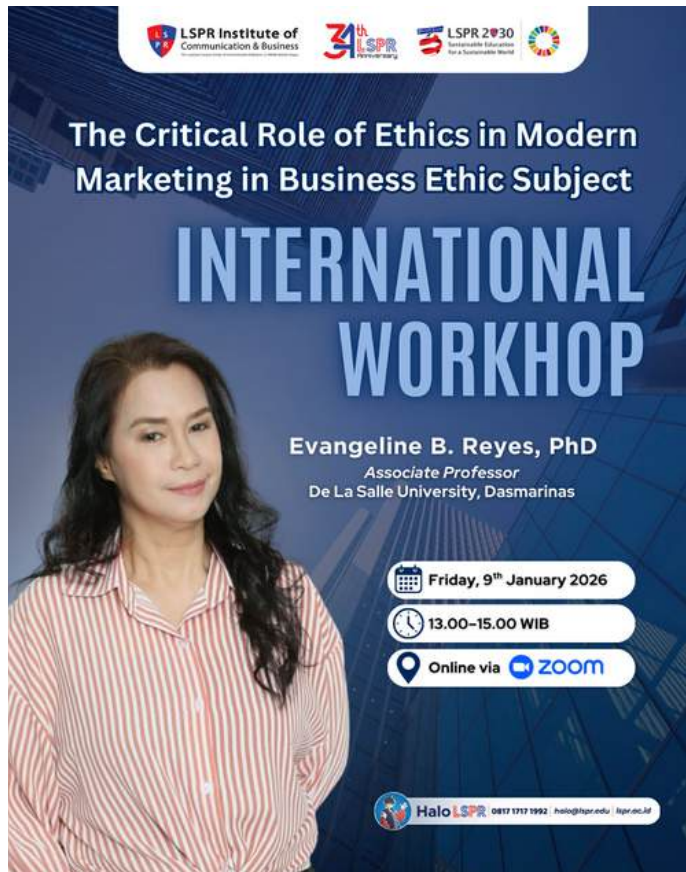

Addressing students from the LSPR Jakarta Campus, Dr. Reyes delivered a lecture titled "The Critical Role of Ethics in Modern Marketing" as part of their Business Ethics course.

The session facilitated a cross-border dialogue on the vital intersection of ethical frameworks and global marketing strategies, highlighting the importance of integrity in the modern corporate landscape.

The initiative was coordinated through Ninis Marhaenis M.I.Kom, LSPR's Manager of International Relations and Deputy Managing Director of the ASEAN PR Network. This partnership between DLSU-D and LSPR, provide both faculty and students with valuable opportunities for intercultural learning and professional growth.

First in the Ph: DLSU-D Hosts Victoria University Delegation for Philippine Legal Immersion



De La Salle University-Dasmariñas (DLSU-D) is hosting the Victoria University (VU) Study Abroad Program, welcoming a delegation of 26 Australian law students.

Running from January 12–24, 2026, the program offers an intensive immersion into the Philippine legal system and Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR).

The delegation is led by Atty. Ryan Dave Berioso, a Law Lecturer at VU and Solicitor of the High Court of Australia, and Pam Christou, the Legal Placements Coordinator at Victoria University.

The academic itinerary features a rigorous series of lectures designed to provide a deep dive into the local legal landscape. The program commenced at the ADG Reception Hall with Dr. Maria Virginia Aguilar, providing the historical and cultural context essential to understanding Philippine law.

The curriculum then shifts to the Centennial Hall for in-depth sessions with Judge Gil dela Banda, covering constitutional governance, the civil law framework, and the litigation process. To provide a comparative perspective on modern legal practice, the program also includes specialized modules on Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) led by Atty. Ryan Berioso (Australia) and Atty. Irene Alogoc (Philippines), an analysis of International Commercial Arbitration by Atty. Jude Marvel, concluding with commercial law by Atty. Roi. Br. Inigo Riola FSC, EdD, President of DLSU-D, formally welcomed the delegation, emphasizing the importance of cross-border academic exchange. This sentiment was echoed by Atty. Berioso, who described the program as a vital "bridge" between the two legal jurisdictions.

"This program reflects something very important to us as a Lasallian university," shared Br. Inigo Riola. "We believe deeply in building relationships and global connections, not only for academic exchange but also for forming responsible global citizens. Partnerships like this remind us that education today is no longer confined by borders. We learn best when we listen to one another and when we allow different contexts and traditions to widen and challenge our perspectives."



Deep Dive into the PH Culture, Justice System



Law students from Victoria University, Australia, who are in the country for an immersion into the Philippine legal system, gained insight into the Philippines' political history and governance at Bahay Ugnayan (Malacañang Heritage Museum) and the Teus Mansion. Throughout the program, the students were immersed in Japanese studies, exploring the country's language, culture, history, and heritage through interactive learning, cultural exchanges, and hands-on activities alongside Meijo University students.

Victoria University Law Students Complete Immersive Law and ADR Program in the Philippines



De La Salle University–Dasmariñas (DLSU-D) successfully concluded a two-week study abroad program for 26 law students from Victoria University (VU), Australia, titled “Philippine Legal System and Alternative Dispute Resolution: A Comparative and Immersive Learning Program,” held from January 12 to 24, 2026.

The program concluded with a ceremony on January 23, 2026, at the ADG Reception Hall, marking the culmination of academic and cultural exchange between the two institutions. Dr. Nor Cachuela, DLSU-D Vice President for Global Engagement and External Relations, opened the event and acknowledged the collaborative efforts behind the program.

Students engaged in lectures on civil law, litigation, and international commercial arbitration led by Judge Gil De La Banda and legal experts Atty. Ryan Dave Berioso, Atty. Irene Alogoc, Atty. Mary Jude Cantorias Marvel, and Atty. Roi Andrei Galang. The learning experience was further enriched through site visits to the Supreme Court of the Philippines, Court of Appeals, Malacañang Heritage Museum, and historical sites in Cavite and Manila.

Certificates of completion were awarded by Atty. Ryan Dave Berioso, in the presence of Pam Christou, VU Legal Placements Coordinator; Dr. Twinkle Amparo, DLSU-D Vice Provost for Academics; Dr. Sonia Gementiza, Chief Administrative Officer; and Atty. Dennis Maldo, Vice Dean of the College of Law.

In her remarks, Pam Christou noted that the program strengthened students' understanding of ADR and reinforced the partnership between Victoria University and DLSU-D. Dr. Sonia Gementiza closed the ceremony by affirming the institutions' continued collaboration.

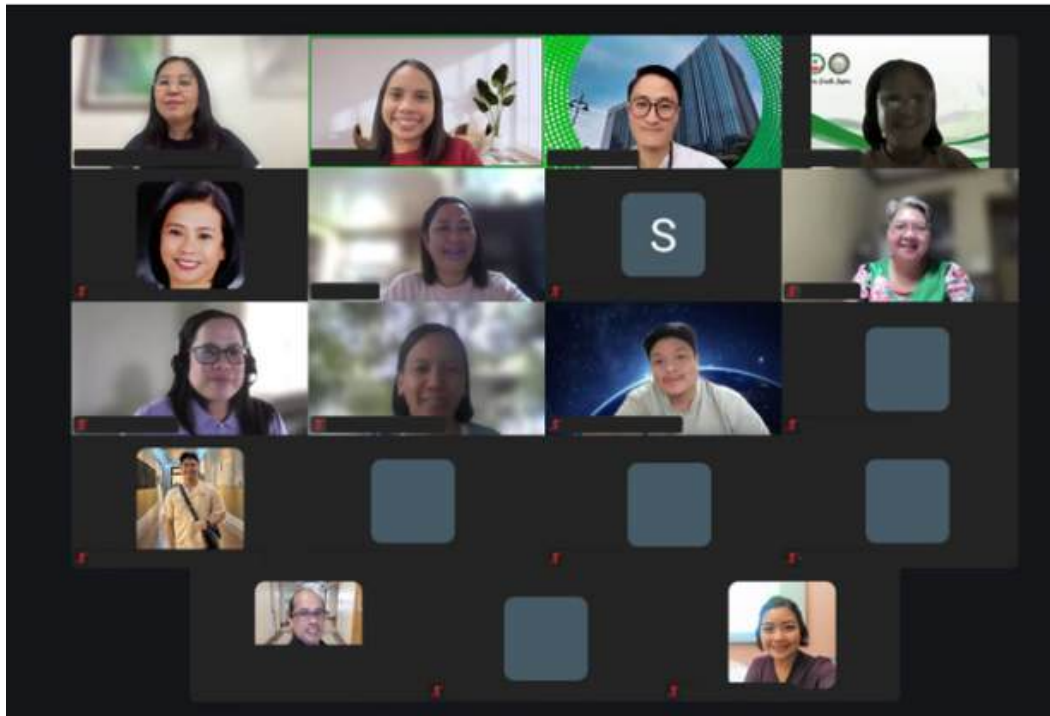

LCDC Joins Waste-Free Beginnings: A Stakeholders' Consultation



The Lasallian Community Development Center (LCDC) participated in Waste-Free Beginnings: A Stakeholders' Consultation held on January 21, 2026, at SK Hall, Nuestra Señora De Candelaria Parish.

Organized by LaKBay ni Juan of the Diocesan Shrine and Parish of Nuestra Señora de Candelaria, in collaboration with the EcoWaste Coalition and the Diocese of Imus Ministry on Ecology, the forum convened key stakeholders, partners, and advocates to address pressing concerns on solid waste management. The consultation aimed to strengthen collaboration among local government units, institutions, and community partners by sharing best practices, examining current waste management conditions, and advancing sustainable, inclusive, and data-driven initiatives.

Morning session featured lectures on the Solid Waste Management Report of Silang, food waste reduction strategies, composting methods, waste segregation, and biogas technology. In the afternoon, participants engaged in workshops designed to exchange experiences and formulate action plans for improved waste management practices.
