for international academic initiatives.








DLSU-D Students Embark on Global Engineering and Architecture Program in Barcelona, Spain

DLSU-Dasmariñas students Ojji Blessan Villamar (CICS) and Bea Martha Mercado (CCJE) are participating in the UMAP Discovery Camp Summer 2025: "Exploring the Path to Sustainability: A Journey from Aceh to Jakarta," held from July 14-25, 2025.

This joint initiative, a collaboration between Universitas Malikussaleh (UNIMAL) and Universitas Esa Unggul (UEU), is providing our participants with firsthand experience in addressing real-world sustainability challenges and solutions. They are actively connecting environmental, social, cultural, food, and economic sustainability with the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Currently, at Universitas Malikussaleh (UNIMAL) in Aceh, the students are delving into the practical implementation of SDGs 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure) and 15 (Life on Land). This includes a deep dive into sustainable industries and the vital role women play in preserving forest ecosystems. Beyond their academic sessions, they're also enjoying and immersing themselves in rich Acehnese cultural performances!

Next, they will head to Universitas Esa Unggul (UEU) in Jakarta. There, the program will shift its focus to SDGs 2 (Zero Hunger), 3 (Good Health and Well-being), 4 (Quality Education), and 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), with engaging sessions on media, nutrition, health, and the economy. They'll even have the chance to learn Indonesian (BIPA), participate in traditional cultural activities, and visit Indonesian museums!

This amazing opportunity is enabling DLSU-D students to collaborate with peers from diverse backgrounds, developing crucial knowledge and skills to promote positive change in their own communities and globally.


London Stock Exchange Group (LSEG) Recognizes DLSU-D Scholars




