Our high school students led a 15-minute chant against corruption and rallied for a transparent government, which will be repeated every Friday for the entire month. At the college level, the University held a Prayer Service for Truth, Transparency, and Integrity in Public Service at the University Chapel, along with the tying of white ribbons to solidify DLSU-D's commitment to this crusade. Both events took place on October 24.

As part of our continued commitment to preparedness in the face of disasters and emergencies, DLSU-D hosted back-toback DRRM events at the Maria Salome Llanera Hall and the Ugnayang La Salle.

DLSU-D successfully hosted the 1st DRRM Summit for DLSP Luzon Schools entitled "OPERATION SAFE!" on October 25. Participants learned how to respond to various types of emergencies such as fires, earthquakes, water-related disasters, and medical emergencies. Sessions were spread out across different parts of the University for the simulations and workshop proper. We hope that what they learned will be applied in actual emergencies, to help and support those in need of immediate aid.

Another multi-sectoral partnership project on DRRM was "Sustainability Practices Towards Disaster Risk Management Amidst Adversity," which brought together experts and practitioners who shared data-driven insights and practical strategies to enhance sustainability and disaster resilience within the Lasallian community and beyond.
