

Helping People in a Way that Others Can't

An unexpected illness set Dr. John Jefferson Besa, affectionately known as JJ, on the path to his current profession. In his youth, he contracted dengue fever, which led to his hospitalization. This experience exposed him not only to the hospital environment but also to the intricacies of healthcare services. He was deeply moved by the tireless efforts of doctors caring for patients and found himself thinking, "I want to help people in a way that others can't." From that moment on, his dream was to become a doctor.

This determination led him to pursue a Bachelor of Science in Biology degree at De La Salle University - Dasmariñas (DLSU-D). It was during his time at the univeristy that his commitment to serving others was further ignited. Dr. II credits his Lasallian education for molding him into a well-rounded and serviceoriented individual. The university's quality curriculum, extra-curricular activities, and formative programs provided various opportunities for personal and professional growth. Notably, he developed strong public speaking skills in Filipino, a valuable asset in his current role in public healthcare.

Dr. JJ recognizes the immense influence of the Lasallian mentors who guided him during his college years. The faculty and staff were not only competent but also collaborative, compassionate, and approachable. He fondly remembers individuals like "Mang Juan," a laboratory staff member, who was exceptionally helpful and patient with him and his classmates as they navigated laboratory equipment.





Dr. II also acknowledges the significant role played by his involvement in the Campus Peer Minister (CPM) group, an auxiliary organization managed by the Campus Ministry Office. Through the guidance of the Campus Ministers including Ms. Diana Roque, currently the Director of the University Lasallian Family Office (ULFO), he was accompanied to recognize God's presence in his life.

Two individuals stand out as particularly influential and inspiring in Dr. II's journey. Dr. Cristina Salibay, his former teacher in the College of Science and current Vice Chancellor for Academics and Research, left a lasting impact. She was strict and highly competent in the classroom, but outside it, she displayed a caring and compassionate nature that made her feel like a second mother to her students. He also remembers Br. Augustine "Gus" Boquer FSC, the former President of DLSU-D, who introduced him to the life and vocation of a Lasallian Brother. Dr. JJ participated in a week-long live-in program with the Lasallian Brothers, gaining insights into their way of life and delving into the teachings of St. John Baptist de La Salle.

These experiences further fueled his desire to serve others, especially those in dire need. Exposed to the harsh realities of society, he felt compelled to answer this call, ultimately choosing a less conventional path. After completing his residency, he decided to work with the Culion Foundation, Inc., a social development organization dedicated to improving the quality of life for Filipinos through public health and community development programs.

Currently, Dr. II focuses on the prevention and control of tuberculosis (TB), engaging with the public, jeepney drivers, vendors, etc., to educate them about TB and encourage them to access the free medication and healthcare services provided by the government. Through this work, he realized the importance of collaboration among different sectors and groups to fully address public health concerns, a principle

he was reminded of from his time at DLSU-D: "communion in mission." For Dr. JJ, addressing health issues must go hand in hand with tackling poverty and other related challenges.

On a lighter note, Dr. JJ is also part of the social media world through the Kwentong Callroom Podcast. This podcast, launched in May 2022, is now being produced by ANIMA Podcasts. Dr. JJ and his best friend engage in conversations about the daily and profound aspects of a doctor's life.

Dr. JJ aspires to complete his postgraduate degree in Public Health, viewing it as a crucial step in advancing his mission to make health-care a basic right for all, rather than a privilege for the fortunate few.



His goal is to ensure that fellow Filipinos receive the treatment they need, regardless of their social status or background. Our young doctor also hopes to enrich his prayer life, a value instilled during his time at DLSU-D. Dr. JJ remembers his experience as a CPM Volunteer when he dedicated time to quiet reflection, meditative prayer, and moments of simply feeling God's presence.

By the way, one thing he misses the in DLSU-D is the "omelet rice" he used to enjoy with his friends at a cafeteria located outside the university.



As a dedicated and hands-on mother, she was committed to being there for her children, especially during their formative years. She thought that herdream of becoming a doctor would remain un-fulfilled, but the unwavering support of her parents, and her husband, Dr. Nathaniel Golla, currently the Vice Chancellor for Academics and Support Services of DLSU-D, encouraged her to return to medical school. With their support, she persevered and graduated. "My father truly believed in me, and that's all it took for me to fulfill my dream, "she warmly recalls. Mother Teresa of Calcutta remains a well-spring of inspiration for Dr. Marissa. Her missionary spirit, deeply rooted in her faith, blossomed during her time at DLSU-D. Our beloved doctor's commitment to serving was further strengthened because of her admiration for individuals who devoted their livesto serving others, notably Dr. Charles Yu. She drew inspiration from his generous spirit, especially when tending to his patients. His good deeds and kindness extended not only to those under his care but to all who worked alongside him, leaving an indelible impression.

Two Lasallian Brothers also had a profound impact on her life. Br. Andrew Gonzales FSC was the first Lasallian Brother she encountered and shook hands with. She regarded him as a promising and dedicated leader of the De La Salle System. Br. Augustine Gus Boquer FSC, on the other hand, stood out for boundless compassion. According to Dr. Marissa, whenever Br Gus visited the De La Salle University Medical Center (DLSUMC), he would engage with patients, lending an empathetic ear to their concerns. He was also the driving force behind improving the ward to serve more people.

According to Dr. Marissa, working in a hospital allows her to practice her faith every day. Since DLS UMC and De La Salle Health Sciences Institute (DLS HSI) is a Catholic institution, she can freely live out her faith, without fear of being persecuted or judged. She prays with her patients, shares her faith with colleagues, and extends a helping hand whenever possible. Being a Lasallian, she strives to assist her colleagues and help them overcome their weaknesses while nurturing their strengths. Dr. Marissa views her work as an opportunity to embody her





spirituality as a Lasallian, a life imbued with faith, compassion, service.Dr. Marissa's and leadership shone brilliantly when the DLS UMCMolecular Laboratory was transformed into a COVID-19 testing facility at the height of the pandemic. It was designated as a COVID Center Cavite the Provincial Under Government. the stewardship and guidance of Dr. Charles Yu, head of the Center, Dr. Marissa took on the role of managing it on ground as she navigated the uncharted waters with grace and determination. As a front liner, she helped set up the system, supervised the planning process, trained the medical personnel, and took charge of the daily operations, all while facing the inherent dangers posed by the virus. Before the pandemic, Dr. Marissa operated a clinic for a year, charging a nominal fee of Php 150.00 per patient. Yet, her compassion knew no bounds. There were times when she waived any fees, particularly for those who were in dire need and lacked the means to pay. Her work extended beyond the walls of the clinic, echoing the principles of self-less service that DLSU-D instilled in her.

In every endeavor and interaction, Dr. Marissa carries the name of De La Salle. She views herself as a bearer of the Lasallian legacy and strives to bring the face of Jesus into all that she does. Her actions transcend mere professional duty; they reflect a profound commitment to serving the greater good. Dr. Marissa Golla is more than a physician; she is also an educator, an administrator, a researcher, and a social mobilizer, all in one. Her multifaceted approach to life embodies the Lasallian spirit of service, commitment, and compassion. In the halls of DLSU-D, she found her calling.
