

URO CONCLUDES FIRST RESEARCH MENTORING WORKSHOP

The University Research Office (URO), in partnership with Languages and Literature Department, successfully concluded the first-ever Research Mentoring Workshop in DLSU-D involving the entire LLD and Kagawaran ng Wikang Filipino (KWP).

The mentoring workshop was facilitated by Dr. Jonathan Gochuico and sought to provide feedback and direction to proposed research topics of the faculty members. This was intended to align them with thrusts of the university towards academic excellence through research and globalization.

Faculty researchers were also tasked to fine tune their topics to maximize their potential for utilization beyond the four walls of the university. Dr. Johnny Ching, Deputy Provost for Research, and Dr. Edwin Lineses, CLAC dean, spoke to the participants about the university and the college's research directions while University Research Office (URO) Director Dr. Jose Aims Rocina enjoined the LLD and KWP faculty to engage in collaborative research to help achieve the goals of the university.

LLD Chair Raymond Ibasco, for his part, shared that among the reasons his department requested for a comprehensive workshop was to provide faculty members with the time and motivation to engage in the endeavor.
