



Experts Discuss Sustainable Development Progress at InCRIS 2025





Close to 600 participants attended De La Salle University-Dasmariñas' 3rd International Conference on Research Inclusivity and Sustainability (InCRIS) from April 23 to 25, 2025. The participants came from Luzon, Visayas, Mindanao, and other parts of Southeast Asia. Themed "Accelerating the Attainment of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through a Data-driven and Integrative Approach," the conference focused on the role of science, data, and collaboration in building a sustainable future.

The three-day event opened with a series of plenary sessions held at Ugnayang La Salle and the Senior High School Complex, Experts from partner universities shared their insights on key issues aligned with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Dr. Nguyen Van Hien of Hanoi National University of Education launched the first day with a presentation on Teacher Training and Professional Development in Vietnam from the Perspective of Sustainable Development.

This was followed by Dr. Narongrit Muangmai from Kasetsart University in Thailand, who spoke about Sustainable Food Systems: Balancing Agricultural Productivity and Environmental Stewardship. Representing Prof. Dr. Diosdado Zulueta, president of Marinduque State University and the Philippine Association of Research Managers Inc. (Philarm), Ms. Jholey Leano-Lancion delivered a talk on Sustainable Development Goals in Philippine State Universities and Colleges: A Data-Driven and Integrative Approach.

On the final day, Dr. Beulah M from Christ University in India shared her expertise on Harnessing Technology for Sustainable Development: Innovations Driving the SDGs. Dr. Johnny Ching, DLSU-D's Deputy Provost for Research, emphasized the importance of using data and science to inform policies and empower communities.

"We must harness the full potential of data, science, and collective action to inspire transformation," he said.



Plenary sessions, workshops, parallel sessions yield fruitful results





Alongside its plenary sessions, the 3rd International Conference on Research Inclusivity and Sustainability (InCRIS) also featured a wide array of workshops and parallel sessions designed to equip participants with practical research and technical skills. Nearly 150 paper and poster presenters participated in the three-day conference, which gathered around 600 attendees from the Philippines and Southeast Asia.

Workshops covered a wide range of topics, including DNA Analysis, Social Research for Cavite Development, OSAEC (Online Sexual Abuse and **Exploitation of Children)** Prevention Training, Psychological First Aid, and Introduction to Scientometrics. Participants also took part in hands-on sessions on Spatial Analysis using Geoda, Systematic Review in Research, UI/UX Design, Effective AI Prompting, and the Use of Pivot Tables and Charts in Excel.

Sessions also focused on technical applications, such as Material Testing, Water and Wastewater Monitoring Using Scientific Meters, and Book Writing and Publishing.

These were facilitated by experts from organizations like Wiseman's Book Trading Inc., HANNA Instruments, SHIMADZU, Diamed Enterprises, XPRT Ventures, WPH Digital, and institutional partners including Rizal Technological University, the Cavite Studies Center, and various DLSU-D departments.

Faculty members from the Technological University of the Philippines-Cavite supported the event by serving as moderators and facilitators during the parallel research presentations.

These workshops demonstrated InCRIS's commitment to not only discussing sustainability goals but also providing participants with actionable knowledge and tools to implement data-driven and inclusive solutions in their own communities.



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Colleges spearhead Research Week activities for students, faculty

De La Salle University-Dasmariñas (DLSU-D) marked a significant academic milestone with its annual Research Week 2025, held from April 21 to 26. The event also featured collegiate activities and WPH workshops, which encouraged student participation.

Organized by the Office of the Deputy Provost for Research, University Research Office, and other academic units, DLSU-D Research Week 2025 affirmed the university's commitment to fostering a research culture that aligns with the global goals for sustainable development.
