This means that both PAASCU and FAAP confirm

- that majority of DLSU-D's programs, being PAASCU-accredited, are quality programs;
- that the University has, among other activities, quality classroom instruction in teaching the said courses, as evidenced by its top performance in the board exams, for example; and
- that the University has sound practices and well-established mechanisms in place to make sure that its brand of quality education is assured, maintained, and sustainable.

This news was relayed to DLSU-D President and Chancellor Br. Gus Boquer FSC in a message, dated May 19, 2015. DLSU-D's institutional accreditation is valid until November 2019.

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

"May we not rest on our laurels and instead commit to continuing efforts to sustain and enhance the quality of our programs and services," she adds. "As we achieve the peak of our accreditation goals, we bring back all the glory to the Almighty God who has been lovingly sustaining all of us."

QAO is in charge of maintaining DLSU-D's standards of quality as recommended by bodies such as PAASCU or CHEd (Commission on Higher Education).

Besides the prestige, DLSU-D's institutional accreditation will certainly help the University maintain its "Autonomous" and "University" statuses with CHEd.

FAAP is the body authorized by CHEd to certify a learning institution's accreditation.

PAASCU, on the other hand, is the country's most credible, internationally prestigious, and most stringent with accrediting standards. Among its affiliations are APQN (Asia-Pacific Quality Network); CIQG (CHEA International Quality Group), a forum for colleges, universities, and accrediting and quality assurance organizations established to address issues and challenges focused on quality and quality assurances in an international setting; ASEM (Asia-Europe Meeting), in which PAASCU is listed in its registry of accrediting agencies; and AQAN (ASEAN Quality Assurance Network).

To be INSTITUTIONALLY ACCREDITED, a university has to have 75 percent or more of its programs accredited. The formula to find this is

To earn institutional accreditation, a big part of the journey was made toward Level 4 accreditation.

- DLSU-D "Core Programs" (Liberal Arts, Business Administration including Accountancy, Science, and Education) at Level 4—the highest level in CHED's program classifications. After meeting stringent expectations, requirements, and conditions, these programs finally got Level 4 accreditation in 2011, and then got reaccredited at Level 4 in 2015. They are scheduled for reaccreditation again in five years.
- Master of Arts in Education programs with majors in Educational Management; in Guidance and Counseling; in Teaching English; in Teaching Filipino; and in Social Sciences at Level 2. They reached "Accredited Status" or Level 2 in 2011, and are scheduled for a resurvey visit in five years.
- Master of Arts in Business Administration; Doctorate in Philosophy programs with majors in Business Administration; in Educational Management; and in Counseling with specialization in School and Community Counseling Program at Level 1 since 2013. PAASCU will visit them again for accreditation in three years.
- Mechanical Engineering; Industrial Engineering; Civil Engineering; Hotel and Restaurant Management; Tourism Management; and Criminology also at Level 1. Three years from now, PAASCU will visit them again for accreditation.
- Electrical Engineering; Electronics Engineering; and Information Technology currently at "candidate level"—these programs have just undergone "preliminary survey" by PAASCU recently. PAASCU has deemed these programs "eligible to apply for a Formal Survey" one year later.
