DLSU-D's MSD faculty facilitate workshop at Int'l Congress

De La Salle University-Dasmariñas College of Science and Computer Studies-Mathematics and Statistics Department (MSD) faculty Ms. Carmela Reyes, chair, Dr. Maxima Acelejado, part-time faculty of the CSCS Graduate School and Ms. Anita Parungao, former part-time faculty, facilitated a workshop which provides background information about the flipped teaching approach and its merits. They also presented their research co-authored with other MSD faculty, Dr. Edna Mercado and Ms. Rhea Mateo, in the13th International Congress on Mathematical Education (ICME-13) held in University of Hamburg, Germany, July 24-31.





The study entitled "Flipped Teaching Approach versus Traditional Teaching Approach" intends to address the need for a much improved achievement in mathematics. It also aimed to describe the profile of the respondents before and after the exposure to the flipped teaching approach and traditional classroom approach in terms of achievement, attitude towards mathematics, anxiety, and confidence. Attended by approximately 3,500 Mathematics educators and researchers from 106 countries, a total of 1, 952 papers and 530 posters were reviewed and accepted which paved way to several plenary panels and speakers, national presentation displays, invited lectures, workshops, and discussions groups.

ICME 13 was hosted by The Society of Didactics of Mathematics

(Gesellschaft für Didaktik der Mathematik), together with other Local Organising Committee such as University of Hamburg and International Commission on Mathematical Instruction and supported by the Federal Ministry of Science, Research and Equality, German Mathematical Society, German Research Society, Springer International Publishing, and Hamburg Convention Bureau.

DLSU-D in Accord with Adventist University of the Philippines

De La Salle University-Dasmariñas and Adventist University of the Philippines in Silang, Cavite signed on July 15 a memorandum of cooperation with prospects of faculty and student exchanges, joint research and publication endeavors, exchanges of information and academic materials and publications, and joint conferences and symposia, among other points of collaboration.
